

Jasper County Junior Livestock Foundation Show Scholarship

The Jasper County Livestock Foundation awards several scholarships each year to deserving students of Jasper County. These scholarships are intended to help those students who have participated in the Jasper County Junior Livestock Show to achieve educational goals beyond high school. The scholarships will be awarded primarily on the basis of achievement, with only a small emphasis on rank in class. All applicants who meet the requirements are urged to apply.

REQUIREMENT FOR APPLICANTS

- Must complete high school graduation requirements during the current school year, August-July, from a secondary school, public or private, be members of 4-H or FFA, and reside in or attend school in Jasper County until completion of high school courses.
- 2) Have a C+ average, 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Have definite plans to attend college or vocational school, excluding active military service.
- Have participated in the Jasper County Junior Livestock Show at least two of the last four years, the current year will be counted as the fourth year.
- Have exhibited good sportsmanship at all times while participating in the Jasper County Junior Livestock Show. No one who has been disciplined or discredited by the JCJLF Association should apply.
- Meet minimum entry requirements for the college or vocational school the applicant plans to attend.
- Only those applicants that score 70 points out of 100 points are eligible for scholarships.
- 8) All Parts of the application should be completed, and verification should be obtained from the applicant's agriculture teacher or a Jasper county extension agent. Any application received missing one or more parts may be disqualified. The parts of the application are as follows:
 - a) This page (Requirements page) signed by the applicant.
 - b) Questions one through fifteen and any additional pages you may need to add to list of all your achievements.
 - c) Scholastic Page completed and signed by school principal or counselor.
 - d) Transcript of high school grades.
 - e) Verification of Application, signed by Ag teacher or County Agent.
- 9) Completed application should be mailed to the following address to arrive by February 1st, 2020. If it is not postmarked, on or before February 1st, 2020 then it will not be considered for a scholarship.
- 10.) All disputes should be made in writing and presented at the April meeting. All disputes are settled by the JCJLFS board of directors. The outcome by the JCJLFS board is final.
